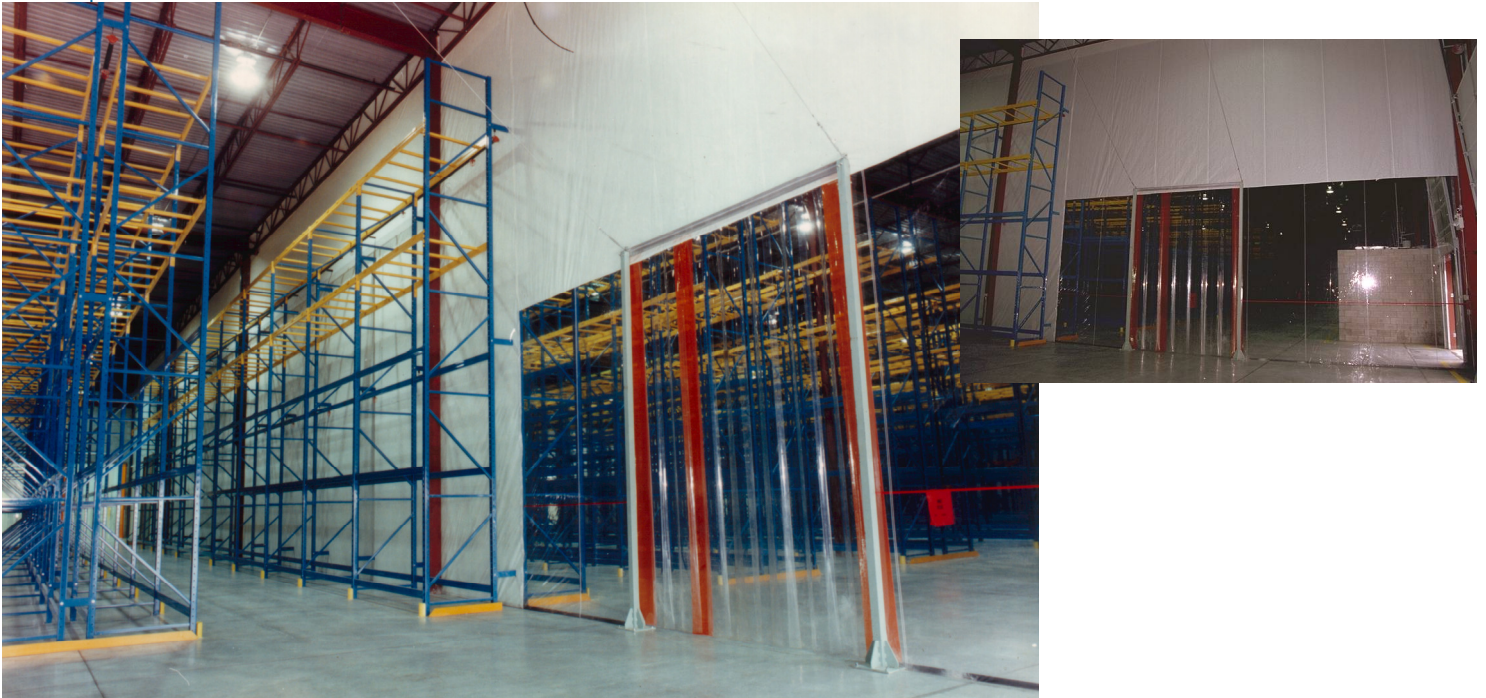


Case Study

Soper's Softwall Partition Solves Cross Contamination Problem at Food Manufacturer



UFL Foods, a world-class manufacturer of a variety of spices for the food industry, needed to divide its new facility into two isolated processing areas to prevent cross-contamination between two major spice categories.

Instead of building a concrete wall, UFL invited Soper's to provide a Softwall partition system to be suspended from the existing ceiling joists. The 170' long X 21' high partition consists of a unique design of 20 foot panels of white translucent polyethylene fabric fastened together with Velcro seams.

Soper's Softwall partition was purchased at half the cost of a traditional rigid wall and installed in one third of the time.

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
